## RSI moves into its new Kyle home

**RSI Inc.** has begun moving into its new Kyle building, and will complete the move into its new home by the end of 2007.

The rugged laptops and IT systems company will take up 40,000 square feet in Kyle, and bring 100 new engineering, manufacturing, management, and support jobs to the city. RSI will keep its distribution warehouse in Pflugerville.

RSI reached an agreement with the city of Kyle in October 2006 to bring as many as 200 jobs to the city in the next five years. Kyle, in turn, will reimburse RSI for its land purchase, based on the number of jobs created and retained.

"RSI is exactly the type of business we want to have in Kyle, not only for their positive economic impact, but for the high level, professional career opportunities they bring to our citizens," says Kyle City Manager Tom Mattis. "We are very excited to have a company with the community values and commitment to quality that RSI brings to our employment base."

Little-Noack designed RSI's new facility with **Structura Inc.** serving as the general contractor.

Starting in January 2008, the company will use its new Kyle home to manufacture new ruggedized wireless routers for heavy equipment manufacturers and commercial transportation entities, ruggedized servers and displays for defense customers worldwide and electro-mechanical assemblies, cable harnesses, integrated racks for oil exploration companies.
